
In the District...

The last few of whatever color is needed seem to be the most difficult. Those who play most often get there sooner than those who don't, but the number of accumulated master points is no indication of the ability of the player. We all know that. The better players still float to the top and some of us are in no hurry to get to that fateful 1000 and over mark where our scores will have to compete against the toughest field.

It seems to me that any incentive or encouragement that can be offered to playe on their "way up" serves to increase the number of aspirants. After all, we all want to see our beloved game prosper and grow - a large field, even diverse and stratified, is a plus for all of us.
