Club happenings

Mega Events at Meridian -by Dian Petrov

In January BC Meridian held several events with pre-dealt boards, where the same hands were played at multiple clubs.

The first one played on January 2 was the ACBL Inter-Club Championship Game - ACBL-wide event wherein ACBL manages the results and across-the-field scoring through the Internet to determine overall rankings at all clubs that participate. The game file is e-mailed to ACBL to be included in the overall scoring. Players earned black regular club masterpoints at the club in addition to club championship masterpoints when they placed in the overalls (players get better amount). Each club represents a separate section and the face-to-face play is complimented with across-the-field scoring through the Internet. **This 141 table event was won nationwide by players from our Unit – Jay Costello and Donna Steffan scored 68.71% and earned 10.06 black points.** Bob Padgug and Gene Finton finished 5th with 65.59% - earning 5.45 masterpoints. The nice bonus from this game is that ACBL provides frequencies from all played hands – the most popular contracts from each board and how many times it was played and with what result. The data is a real representation of what the most “on par” result is and the players can fairly analyze their performance. On January 23 and 24 Meridian participated at the charitable events organized by the World Bridge Federation. The club donated a dollar per player to UNICEF. At those fun charity events same hands were played at multiple clubs around the world and participants checked and followed their scores against fellow bridge players from around the globe in countries like England, Peru, Jordan, Japan, Germany and others. Those were an enjoyable couple of days while raising money for charity. Monday’s event was played in 20 clubs by 412 pairs and Tuesday’s - in 21 clubs by 377 pairs. Meridian contributed with 16 and 10 tables respectively. Again participants can download club frequencies and overall frequencies, which provide really interesting material for those interested in analyses. The organization handling and processing the results is the same that process the results in the ACBL World Pairs Games at the beginning of June each year. Their website is www.ecatsbridge.com. The top pairs from our unit on Monday were Vince Pesce and Jerry Geiger, 60.75% (24th worldwide); Bev Cohen and Judith Padgug, 60.21% (29th); Dorothy and Ed Rupp, 57.12% (67th). And on Tuesday - Dale Anderson and Bob Padgug, 63.64% (13th worldwide); Dan Gerstman and Christine Urbanek, 63.22% (16th); Jim Gullo and Judith Padgug, 60.19% (26th). All players received a souvenir brochure with analyses for each hand.

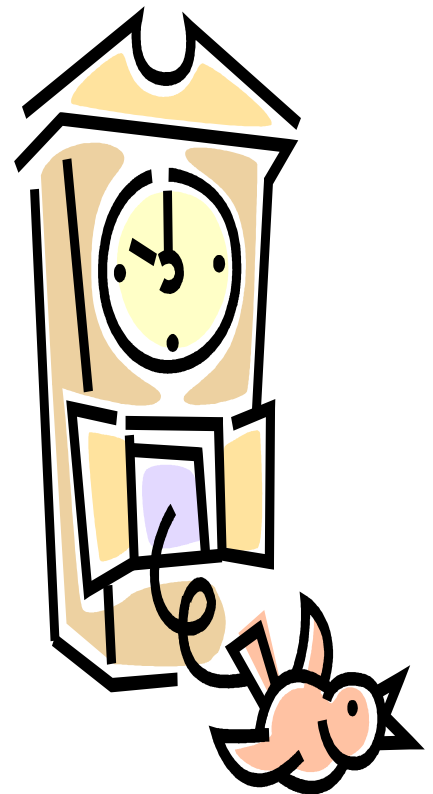

Beware the 6 of clubs!

Variations on Bd. 21 (Bridge Center - 1/7/12)

Contract: 4♥. No matter how hard you look, declarer must discover the "backward" ♦ finesse in order to make 10 tricks. There is no squeeze because there is no threat in the S hand and E discards after N so he can adjust accordingly. More subtle is the fact that the location of the ♣ 6 is crucial. As W, would you realize that you must neither lead the ♣6 nor discard a ♣ during the play of this hand? To do so transforms S's 5 spot into a threat behind what Clyde Love called "the busy hand," and the squeeze is on!

Look at it another way. What would happen if we switched the 5 and 6 of ♣s?

Let's follow one possible line of play. W leads a low ♥ to the A, a ♥ is returned to the K. Suppose neither side wants to commit in the minors yet and declarer is willing to give up 2 ♠ to rectify the count in case a squeeze is in the cards.

Recap: The fundamental idea here is that for a squeeze to work, at least one of the threat cards must play after the hand burdened with guarding two suits. If the only threats were in the N hand, which discards before E, then E could adjust accordingly.

Position after trick 5 having played 2 ♥s and 3 ♠s.

If E discards a ♣, declarer cashes his K and A and his 6 spot is good to discard dummy's ♦ loser. If E discards a ♦, declarer takes the last 6 tricks with 4 ♦s and 2 ♣s.

Savor the crucial pressure exerted by the ♣ 6! Were it not for that, W would have a ♣ guard and E would be under no pressure. Note again, that in the hand as dealt, must not part with a ♣ from his 642. Would you have known that?
