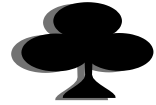

The Unit 116 Board election will be concluded on Sunday December 17, 2006 at the Annual Party and Meeting at Daemen College. The election committee (**Michael Kisiel**, **Vince Pesce** and **Faith Perry**) are searching for candidates who would be interested in running for the board.

OBJECTS OF THE ORGANIZATION

The objects of the organization are

- (a) To preserve and promote the best interests of and to stimulate interest in the art of playing competitive duplicate contract bridge and any modifications thereof.
- (b) To cooperate with and assist the League in the promotion and conduct of contract bridge tournaments.

(c) To encourage the highest standards of conduct and ethics by its members, and to enforce such standards.

(d) To promote the development and organization of affiliated clubs within the Unit.

(e) To cooperate in the League's charity program and to sponsor and conduct charity events with the object of realizing funds to be devoted to worthy humanitarian causes.

(f) To conduct such other activities as may be in keeping with its principal objectives.

Nomination And Election Of Directors

(a) The Board of Directors, at least 120 days prior to the annual membership meeting, shall select a Nominating Committee composed of three (3) persons, a majority of whom shall not be members of the current Board of Directors.

(b) The names of the person nominated as Directors by the Nominating Committee shall be made known to the members at least ninety (90) days prior to said meeting.

(c) Additional nominations may be made by the membership and submitted to the nominating Committee sixty (60) days prior to the annual meeting. Such nominations must be in writing, signed by at least twenty-five (25) members in good standing.

In order to comply with the unit's by-laws a list of the candidates has to be made known to the members by September 15, 2006. The committee encourages all members to at least consider running for the board and if they have any additional questions please contact members of the election committee or any of the past or present board members. We need candidates to continue the work of the unit board and also to provide new ideas for the board which will able the board to function more efficiently in meeting the needs of the unit's members.

Angel Pie
(Serves 6-8)

4 egg whites

1 cup granulated sugar
¼ tsp cream of tartar
½ tsp. Vanilla

Beat egg whites until stiff. Beat in cream of tartar and sugar slowly. Add vanilla. Spread into a buttered 9" pie pan. Bake 10 min @ 275 degree. Then 30 minutes at 250 degree. Spread ½ cup Heavy cream whipped over shell. Beat 4 egg yolks until thick with 4 tbsp. Sugar and 4 tbsp lemon juice. Cook over hot water until thick. Cool and spread on pie. Spread thin layer of whipped cream over all. Enjoy!

Reporter's Column

From **John Ricotta** we received the following:

While playing with **Dian Petrov** in the Erie, PA Sectional last year on October 1, 2005, I was dealt the following hand:

Spades	Ax
Hearts	Void
Diamonds	AQJxx
Clubs	98xxxx

Nothing spectacular, but enough to Bid. We then get the following bidding war:

W	S	E	N (me)
1H	2N	P	3H
3S	P	4S	5C
P	P	5S	6C
P	P	X	All pass

Dian's bid was a "special for minors" bid, promising length in the two lowest unbid suits. My 3H bid told him I had a good hand and asked him to bid his better suit. When he passed, I was forced to choose, so I chose my longer club suit. After my LHO led the KS, the following dummy was revealed:

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Spades	x
Hearts	xx
Diamonds	Txxxx
Clubs	AQJTx

I won the ace in my hand and, after leading a small club, the CK popped on my left! After my RHO followed suit, I was so stunned, that I played another high club, both opponents discarding, of course. I then let the DT ride and my LHO showed out! After taking the marked finesse again, I claimed all 13 tricks for a top board! 6CX, making 7, holding only 18 HCP between us!
